# Waste of Space Walk Easter Edition



Take a walk around your school grounds with your pupils or students and find some wasted spaces.

#### You will need:

- Paper Easter eggs (printed on next page)
- Scissors and colouring materials
- Make shift egg baskets any container that will hold multiple paper eggs

#### **Get started:**

- 1. Choose your Easter eggs (printed on next page) and spend some time colouring them in. Don't forget to write your name and class on the back.
- 2. Prepare to go outside, look at the weather, do I need wellies or a coat?
- 3. Take a walk around your school grounds and STOP whenever someone spots an area they think is a waste of space.
- 4. At the waste of space, discuss with each other if you agree or disagree. Why have you chosen that space to be a Waste of Space? What would you like to see in this space instead?
- 5. Students and pupils 'vote' on whether they agree or disagree that this space is a Waste of Space by placing eggs in your make shift egg basket. Make a note of which location the egg basket refers to.
- 6. Continue steps 3,4,and 5 until everyone has given up their eggs.
- 7. At the end of the walk, count the eggs up to give a total for each chosen Waste of Space location.
  - Which Waste of Space has the most eggs? Do these spaces have the potential of being transformed into better spaces for pupils, students, and wildlife? Map your Waste of Space on our interactive map -



- 3. Ask your teacher to kindly deliver the postcards to your headteacher or put them up on a notice board in the hallways.



- Scissors and colouring materials
- Make shift ballot boxes any container that will hold multiple ballots

#### Get started:

- 1. Cut out and colour in your voting ballots. Don't forget to write your name and class on the back.
- 2. Prepare to go outside, look at the weather, do I need wellies or a coat?
- 3. Take a walk around your school grounds and STOP whenever someone spots an area they think is a waste of space.
- 4. At the waste of space, discuss with each other if you agree or disagree. Why have you chosen that space to be a Waste of Space? What would you like to see in this space instead?
- 5. Students and pupils 'vote' on whether they agree or disagree that this space is a Waste of Space by placing ballots in your make shift ballot box. Make a note of which location the box refers to.
- 6. Continue steps 3,4,and 5 until everyone has voted.
- 7. At the end of the walk, count the votes to get a total for each chosen Waste of Space location.
  - Which Waste of Space has the most votes? Do these spaces have the potential of being transformed into better spaces for pupils, students, and wildlife?


